



## SIM2 DOMINO D80E

**O**ne of the main objectives of installing a projector in a home theatre is to recreate the cinema feel. Not only does the Domino D80E achieve this objective with a head-turning 1920 x 1080 picture, it is also compatible with 24 frames per second playback.

So, when the projector is connected to a Blu-ray disc player with 24fps output, it doesn't need to add a frame here or there as other display devices with different frame rates need to do. What viewers of the D80E will watch is exactly how the film's director intended it to be seen.

Colour and brightness were the strengths of the D80E we noticed when we connected the device to Pioneer's LX70a Blu-ray disc player.

Clarity was razor sharp for our viewing of Disney's *Ratatouille* — the fine fur on the title character so clear we could count each hair. The D80E owes its superb picture to the Unishape lamp system and colour enhancement engine.

The Unishape is a modulating lamp that can control its light output a millisecond at a time in conjunction with the proprietary AlphaPath light engine to ensure accurate brightness, contrast and colour. Contrast is listed as 4500:1, and even gives detail in darker areas of the picture.

The Domino D80E is available in two cabinet colours — matte black or white to suit the rooms decor — and is relatively small for a full high definition projector at 35cm wide, 31cm deep and 17.3cm deep. It can project a screen size between 127cm (50-inch) and 7.5 metres (300-inch) and lamp life is up to 4000 hours.

While no decibel level is listed in the product's specifications, the D80E was quiet enough not to be noticed even during the quieter moments of a movie. The D80E also has HDMI, composite and S-Video connectivity.
